Botox Cosmetic & Dysport Consent Form

I understand that I will be injected with a botulinum toxin, such as Botox or Dysport, in the area of the glabella, forehead, crow's feet, or other facial area, to paralyze facial muscles temporarily.

Injection of botulinum toxin into small muscles of the face cause those specific muscles to halt their function (be paralyzed), thereby improving the appearance of the wrinkles. I understand the goal is to decrease the wrinkles in the treated area. This paralysis is temporary, and re-injection is necessary within three to four months.

Touch up treatments may be necessary to maintain desired results. No guarantee, warranty, or assurance has been made to me as to the results that may be obtained. Clinical results will vary per patient. I agree to adhere to all safety precautions and regulations during the treatment. *No refunds will be given for treatments received.*

The possible side effects of botulinum toxin include but are not limited to:

Risks: I understand there is a risk of bruising, swelling, rash, headache, local numbness, pain at the injection site, weakness of adjacent muscles, incomplete effect, asymmetric eyebrows, eyebrow droop, eyelid droop, smile asymmetry, allergic reaction, and respiratory problems.

Another risk when injecting botulinum toxin around the eyes includes corneal exposure, because people may not be able to blink the eyelids as often as they should to protect the eye. This inability to protect the eye has been associated with damage to the eye as impaired vision, or double vision, which is usually temporary. This reduced blinking has been associated with corneal ulcerations. With regard to eyelid droop, there are medications that can help lift the eyelid, however, if the drooping is too great, the eye drops are not that effective. These side effects can last for several weeks or longer.

As botulinum toxin injections are not an exact science, there might be an uneven appearance of the face with some muscles more affected than others. In most cases, this uneven appearance can be corrected by injecting botulinum toxin in the same or nearby muscles. However in some cases, this uneven appearance can persist for several weeks or months. The number of units injected is an estimate of the amount of Botox required to paralyze the muscles. I understand there is no guarantee of results of any treatment. I understand the regular charge applies to all subsequent treatments. I understand more than one injection may be needed to achieve a satisfactory result.

- I am not pregnant or breastfeeding.
- I do not have any allergies to egg, albumin, or cow's milk proteins.
- I do not have any neuromuscular disease or weakness.
- I understand that botulinum toxin injections have specific FDA approvals for injection into certain areas of the face. Some areas that may be injected may be considered "Off-Label" if they do not have specific FDA approval for the certain area. I understand that this does not mean that the proposed use is experimental, but rather deemed to be safe and effective by Dr. Jandali and his staff.

- I understand that this consent is valid and active for all future botulinum toxin injections at Jandali Plastic Surgery by either Dr. Shareef Jandali or one of his designees (RN, NP, or PA).
