

General Information:

- 1. "MOHS Surgery" is a technique utilized by specially trained Dermatologist to remove and evaluate certain types of skin cancers.
- 2. MOHS technique may be beneficial in a number of locations on the body. However, it is usually indicated for sensitive areas on the head and neck region.
- 3. There is not universal agreement on which patients MOHS should or should not be performed; and, therefore, it is usually based on the referring physician's clinical judgment and experience.
- 4. Not all patients referred for MOHS will be candidates for the procedure and scheduling delays are not unusual due to the popularity of the procedure.
- 5. The MOHS doctor will meet with patients prior to scheduling the procedure.
- 6. MOHS doctors are capable of closing small skin defects after cancer removal.
- 7. Special request can be made in advance for a <u>Board Certified Plastic Surgeon</u> to close the open wound the following day.

Technique:

- 1. MOHS technique involves a specially trained <u>Dermatologist</u> removing the skin cancer while patient is awake under local in their office.
- 2. After the cancer is removed it is placed on a grid and evaluated under the microscope with frozen section to determine if the cancer has been fully removed
- 3. Multiple passes are performed as necessary until the cancer is gone and there is an adequate margin for cure.
- 4. Most Dermatologists then send the margins for "permanent" evaluation to ensure accuracy and a long term cure.
- 5. MOHS has a reported cure rate of 98% for most cancers and reportedly preserves as much critical tissue as possible while ensuring cure.
- 6. MOHS in some cases allows awake patients to see the size and position of the defect after skin cancer removal to better prepare and choose the reconstruction.

Scheduling:

- 1. On occasion, Dr. James Lowe will recommend a MOHS evaluation.
- 2. He will arrange MOHS when indicated at the patient's request.
- 3. If you wish to be referred for MOHS make sure we forward your records prior to your scheduled visit.
